Role	Description
Driver	Drivers are the people with lived experience who are at the centre of the work. They are autistic people and people with a learning disability and are being called the 'Drivers' in this process.
	The Autism Drivers are members of the Autism Advisory Forum. The Learning Disability Drivers are members of The Assembly.
	The Drivers will inform all recommendations to Ministers and COSLA.
	The Drivers will take an advisory role and will be supported to lead and develop the vision.
Allies	Allies are people who have an interest in or experience of championing the human rights of autistic people or people with a learning disability and who are committed to working together with those people with lived experience to highlight the issues affecting them and support them to make real, lasting change in their lives.
