Creating working groups



Working groups focused on priority areas from research and discussion. The working groups co-produced outputs and activity. The learning disability Drivers decided they wanted to work in one group and the autistic Drivers took two priority areas. This was based on the number of people involved and the resource to support the work.

Therefore, three working groups were formed. The working groups co-produced resources.

Learning disability Drivers working group

Agree, develop and test resources needed to raise awareness and improve general understanding of what it is like to live with a learning disability and more explicitly how people's mental health is impacted and the challenges and barriers faced in accessing mental health services and supports.

Autistic Drivers - GP and other practice staff working group

Improving training and understanding among health professionals was a priority areas and the group agreed to focus on GP services. The group developed training materials and resources to make GP services more accessible to autistic people and support improved mental health.

Autistic Drivers - Autism Informed Services working group

To develop co-produced professional learning resources for all NHS professionals working in adult services or with adults. This includes mental health services.











The groups agreed an accessible planning and evaluation model to use. It looked like this:
